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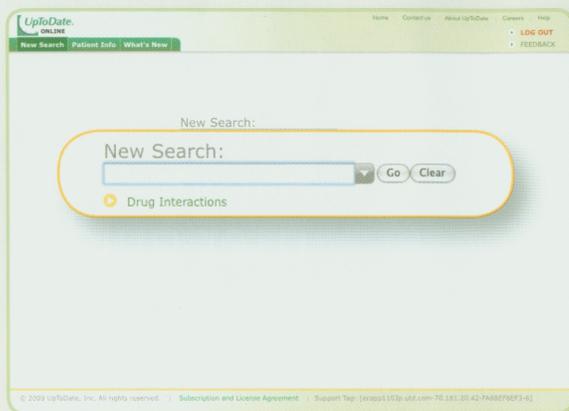
INTRODUCTION — The treatment of hypertension is the most common reason for office visits of non-pregnant adults to physicians in the United States and for use of prescription drugs [1]. Analysis of NHANES data from 1999-2000 and United States Census bureau information results in an approximately 29 to 31 percent incidence of hypertension in the 18 year and older population of the United States [2,3]. This translates into 58 to 65 million hypertensives in the adult population in the United States, which is substantially higher than the 43.2 million estimate derived from the 1988-1991 NHANES-III survey [3,4].

The number of patients with hypertension is likely to grow as the population ages since either isolated systolic hypertension or combined systolic and diastolic hypertension occurs in over one-half of persons older than 65 years (show figure 1) [5]. The rising incidence of obesity will also increase the number of hypertensive individuals [5]. (See "Treatment of hypertension in the elderly, particularly isolated systolic hypertension").

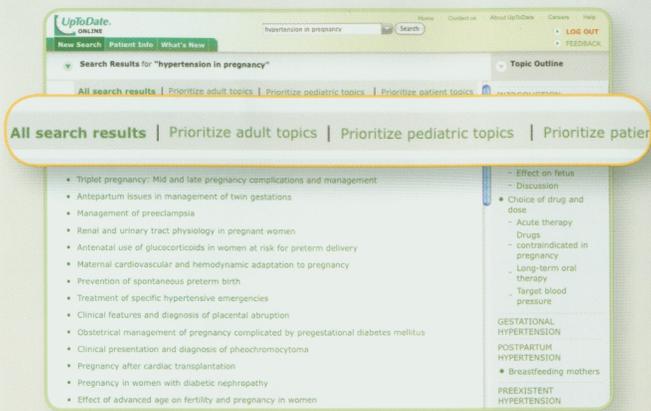
Despite the prevalence of hypertension and its associated complications, control of the disease is far from adequate [6-8]. Data from NHANES show that only 34 percent of persons with hypertension have their blood pressure under control, defined as a level below 140/90 mmHg (show table 1) [7].

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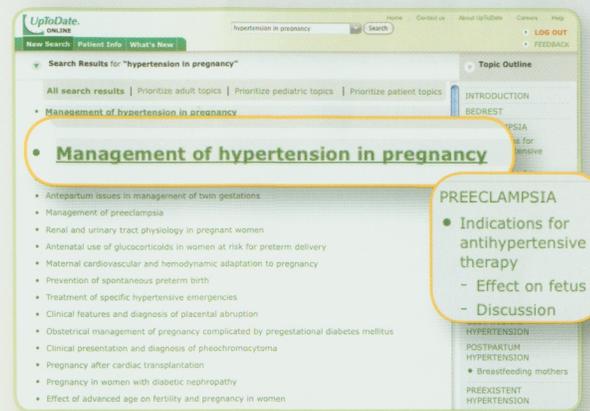
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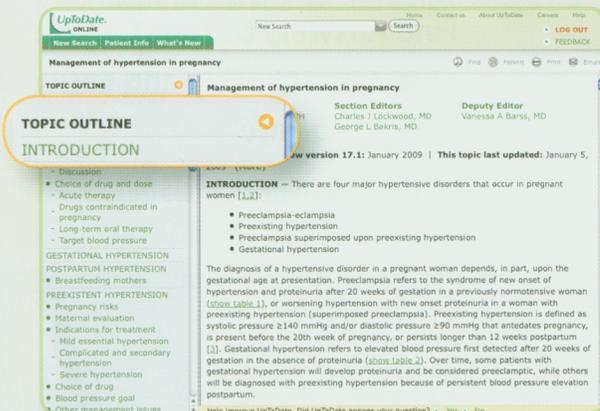
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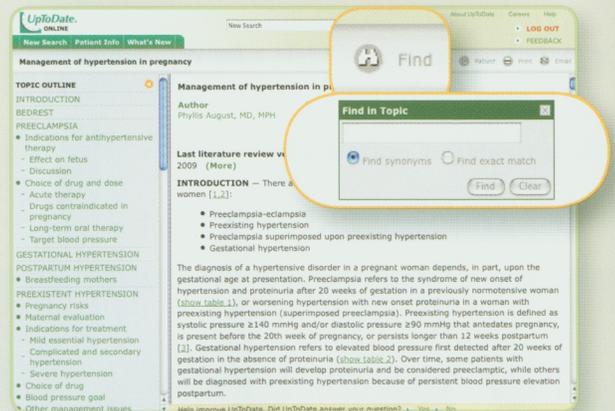
- 2 Prioritize the order in which topics appear on the Search Results page. View the titles in the default order (All search results) or choose Prioritize adult topics, Prioritize pediatric topics or Prioritize patient topics to display adult, pediatric or patient topics first.



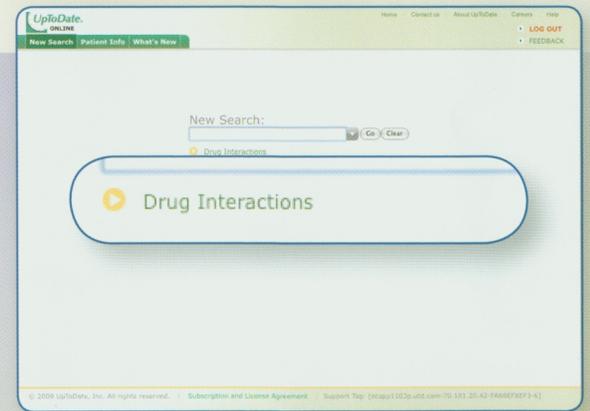
- 3 Access topics from the Search Results page. Click on a topic title to display the topic; position the mouse pointer over the topic title to view the topic outline. And click on a heading within the outline to link to a specific section.



- 4 Use topic outlines. Click on a heading in the outline to access the corresponding section of the topic. The topic outline also includes links to related topics and associated graphics.



- 5 Find text within topics. Click Find and enter the text for which you want to search. Select Find synonyms if you want to find both exact matches and synonyms, or select Find exact match if you want to find only exact matches. Click Find to highlight all occurrences of the text. To clear highlighted text, click Clear.



- Access the drug interactions database* (online only). Click on the highlighted arrow on the search screen to review drug-to-drug, drug-to-herb, and herb-to-herb interactions with the Lexi-Interact™ drug interactions program.
